New online store

BEMCC members can soon visit the BEMCC site to purchase emergency preparedness products. The store will include, but is not limited to the following items:

- Medical Record Key Secure USB key chains that hold your medical and emergency contact information
 ensure the availability of critical information in the event of an accident. For your privacy, a password
 protects access to information on this device. You can also opt to have your information stored in our
 secure online database.
- Emergency Road Kits These kits will contain essential tools needed to enhance your safety when waiting for help, such as flares, a flashlight, a raincoat, and a 10 by 5 inch canister good for storing non-perishable foods.
- Resource Directory It's taken BEMCC 30 years to build the contacts and relationships needed to eliminate
 red tape for emergency evacuations from Mexico. You can have access to those contacts by purchasing the
 BEMCC Resource directory available soon.

3. OMAR ELIZONDO EVACUATED FROM MEXICO AFTER EXPERIENCING A HEART ATTACK

"...One of the doctors in Cabo San Lucas was a Diaz, then there's Mrs. Celia Diaz and my grandmother was a Diaz. I was very close to my grandmother ... I think she was taking care of me."

In 1996, fisherman Omar Elizondo traveled to Cabo San Lucas in Baja California Sur, Mexico for the first time. He's been in love with it ever since and returns often for what he says is "some of the best Marlin fishin' in the world".

He became a BEMCC member five years ago after reading about our services online. For many years, Elizondo traveled to Mexico without problems. But on August 30, 2007, Elizondo used BEMCC's services for the first time. More...

4. LOOKING BACK ON THE OCTOBER 2007 WILDFIRES

Emergencies happen in all sorts of unimaginable ways at unexpected times and have the power to affect lives, not only in the precious moments of the event, but also in the days, months and years to come. The October 2007 wildfires are long behind us, but the rebuilding process has been difficult for many families. BEMCC is proud to have helped reunify families by contacting and communicating with several burn centers throughout San Diego County. In addition to providing assistance in the reunification process, BEMCC helped several families who lost children, parents, spouses and other loved ones get back on their feet.

On May 4, 2008, a new law banning after-market tint on vehicles went into effect in Tijuana, Mexico. Drivers going into Mexico from San Diego County and elsewhere in the U.S. are required to peel off tint from their vehicles or face a \$50 fine and have their vehicle towed. Drivers of vehicles towed under this new law will not be allowed to reclaim their cars until tinting is peeled off and all towing fees are paid.

6. SEND US YOUR BLANKETS AND TOYS

BEMCC collects new, packaged blankets and toys throughout the year for the annual blanket and toy drive. On average, 5,000 - 6,000 blankets and toys are delivered each year to needy children and families on both sides of the border. Due to the October 2007 wildfires, our last drive yielded well below the average with only 1,000 blankets and toys. Please help us to make up for it this year! If you can't send blankets, monetary donations are accepted and volunteer opportunities are available.

The blanket and toy drive take place in the winter. Exact dates and times will be available soon.
