Hello to all of you and our Mexico friends across the border. This is a special edition Newsletter with much more information than our previous ones. Recently I received an email inquiring about similar programs that offer evacuation assistance, and what do we offer compared to these other companies? I thought this was a great opportunity to tell all of our members what your Binational membership really provides, and how many others are involved once you or a loved one are involved in a critical medical emergency while traveling in Mexico.

Binational Emergency is the ONLY organization who specializes in coordination of evacuation for those who travel into Mexico. While other companies offer evacuation services in other countries including Mexico, Binational Emergency has over 35 years dedicated to working with Mexican officials, Police Authorities, Mexican Consulate, Embassies, hospital personnel, and local Mexican ambulance companies. These special relationships are crucial when a person is involved in an accident or medical emergency. Our office is located only 10 miles from the U.S./Mexico border. Our 24/7 answering service has bilingual staff ready to take your call in an emergency, and once your call is received your membership insures you swift action and coordination of all personnel involved to get you back safely to a U.S. hospital. Not only do we arrange and coordinate your evacuation, but we also keep your emergency contact with updates to your situation. No other company is more dedicated in insuring your safe return.

But how does Binational do this? What makes Binational a cut above the rest? Binational is also involved in your community. Our Executive Director, Celia Diaz, takes the time to establish personnel relationships with the U.S. Coast Guard, Immigration officials, first responders and hospital personnel on both sides of the border. She also works with U.C.S.D clinics such as the South Bay Radiation Oncology center to help transport cancer patients. Annual food, toy and blanket drives help those less fortunate. There is also cooperation with other non-profit agencies such as the Desert Angels. So please, read on to discover how much we consider you as family, and what your membership is involved in!
